This is the sixth workbook of a seven-part series. Reviews basic italic, numerals, and the cursive italic program. Writing practice includes word origins, word groups, figures of speech, and word entertainment. Explores history of the alphabet. Illustrated.

Italic is a modern handwriting system based on enduring letterforms that are highly suited to rapid and legible writing. Italic conforms to natural, rhythmic hand movements. Italic builds on previously learned concepts and the letter shapes remain the same from basic to cursive, eliminating the abrupt leap from "ball and stick" to looped cursive. Self-assessment is an integral part of the Getty-Dubay program.
