This is the fourth workbook of a seven-part series. Reviews basic italic, numerals, and covers the cursive italic program. Writing practice includes forms of poetry, homographs, phonograms, and tongue twisters. Explores history of the alphabet. Illustrated.

Italic is a modern handwriting system based on enduring letterforms that are highly suited to rapid and legible writing. Italic conforms to natural, rhythmic hand movements. Italic builds on previously learned concepts and the letter shapes remain the same from basic to cursive, eliminating the abrupt leap from "ball and stick" to looped cursive. Self-assessment is an integral part of the Getty-Dubay program.



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
